Read Easy

Helping adults learn to read

Read Easy UK is a small, but rapidly growing charity. Founded by Ginny Williams-Ellis in 2010, we provide free, confidential, one-to-one reading coaching for adults, from trained volunteers, through locally-run, affiliated volunteer groups.

2.4 million adults in England can barely read or cannot read at all. (Skills for Life Survey, 2011, Dept. BIS). This means they struggle even to do their food shopping, use cash points, read bus timetables or understand health warnings. Going to the doctor, filling in forms or engaging with the benefits system can all be overwhelmingly challenging. Finding work can also be very difficult if you can't read well.

Repair Shop presenter, Jay Blades, is taking part in a new BBC documentary which will follow his journey as he faces up to the challenge of learning to read as an adult with the support of a Read Easy Reading Coach.

The Four Stones Multi Academy Trust is seeking to appoint a Clerk to the Local Governing Body at The De Montfort School.
